

Short Bio for Emi Nakamura

Emi Nakamura is the E. Morris Cox Professor of Economics in the Berkeley Economics department. Her research focuses on monetary and fiscal policy, business cycles and macroeconomic measurement. She is a member of the American Academy of Arts and Sciences, co-director of the Monetary Economics program at the National Bureau of Economic Research and serves on the Congressional Budget Office's Panel of Economic Advisers. She is a recipient of the John Bates Clark medal, awarded to the American economist under the age of forty judged to have made the most significant contribution to economic thought and knowledge. She has also been awarded the Elaine Bennett Research Prize, the NSF Career Grant, and the Sloan Research Fellowship, and in 2014 was named by the IMF as one of the Top 25 Economists under 45. She served previously on the Bureau of Labor statistics Technical Advisory Committee, the Federal Economic Statistics Advisory Committee, the Executive Committee of the American Economics Association and as co-editor of the American Economic Review. She holds a PhD from Harvard University and an A.B. from Princeton University, and taught at the Columbia economics department and business school before joining the Berkeley economics department in 2018.
